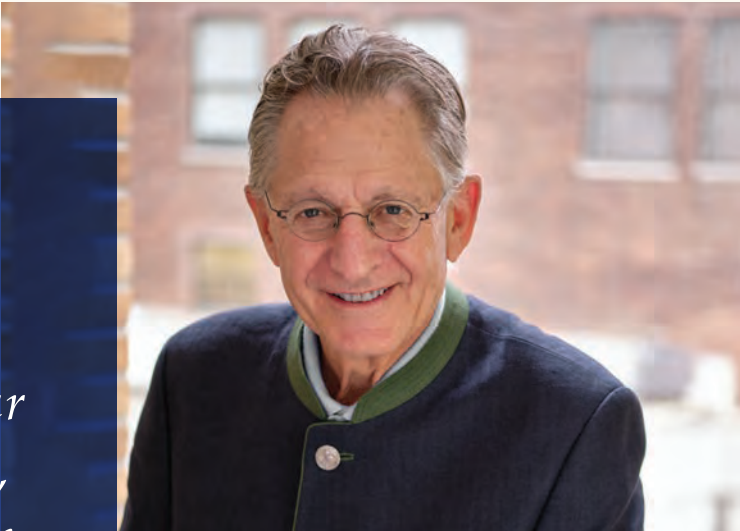

Connection is at the heart of our mission: Selfhelp is there for our clients because our donors are here for us, sharing a core belief in, and commitment to, ensuring independence and dignity for New Yorkers as they age.

Through these pages, you'll read how people, foundations, and legacy support serve to underpin and sustain Selfhelp's mission. The cover of this year's report is in celebration of the mission that you help us actualize every day.

With Selfhelp playing matchmaker, the connection between our donors and those we serve closes financial gaps so that staff can develop long-lasting, trusting relationships with clients and continue to be there in times of calm and times of crisis, like Mrs. K, who has been attending our coffee houses since 2013. In 2016, she participated in Witness Theater, but over the course of the year, she suffered from a series of falls and was unable to complete the program. We were able to provide her with home care and then increase the number of hours she receives to ensure that she remains safe at home. Or, like Mr. M, a resident in Selfhelp's housing who avoided hospitalization because his social worker noticed a persistent cough and suggested that he see his doctor, who was then able to diagnose and treat bronchitis before it got worse.

The support of our donors is nowhere more evident than in how Selfhelp continues to grow. Innovation is key to our sustainability. Funded by the JP Morgan Chase Foundation, we conducted research to demonstrate what we have long known, that the effect of our healthy housing approach to wellness in our residences supports residents' health with targeted services if and when needed. Among other beneficial results, we found that residents in Selfhelp housing were 51% less likely to be hospitalized than non-residents. The study has enriched the affordable housing sector and has been presented at national conferences and utilized in advocacy and policy discussions.

These striking personal and statistical results -- and so many more in our Holocaust Survivor, home care, and community based programs -- underscore the difference our donors make in the lives of those we serve. You, our supporters, play a critical role in our ability to provide care in the community where older people overwhelmingly prefer to live.

Thank you for all that you've helped us to accomplish in 2019. We look forward to your continued faith and trust in 2020.

Katie and her family know that philanthropy means opportunity. When Board member Tai Wang invited Jerry to join Selfhelp's Chinese Advisory Council in 2015, he was immediately taken by Selfhelp's deep connections with the Chinese community. He toured our housing residences and visited with Chinese-speaking tenants who expressed how happy and grateful they were to live in such beautiful and well-maintained apartments. He was most impressed by the Mandarin-speaking social worker at each building, there to ensure the well-being of each resident.

When Jerry first visited Selfhelp's Benjamin Rosenthal-Prince Street Senior Center in Flushing, he was moved by the hundreds of engaged older adults, fully participating in activities like ballroom dancing, karaoke, and yoga classes – not to mention the fresh lunches served to more than 400 members each day.

"Just as Selfhelp was there for those who came to this country in the 1930s and 1940s, Selfhelp continues to assist immigrants, and today is a recognized leader in providing excellent services to our Chinese elders. I'm proud to be a part of it."

Magda and Max Hull were early Selfhelp volunteers who, having had the good fortune of emigrating from Nazi Germany before the Holocaust, dedicated themselves to helping those who were not as fortunate. It is indeed meaningful that their children, Cathy and Roger, have continued their legacy by establishing the Magda and Max Hull Emergency Cash Assistance Fund. This special fund provides financial assistance to Selfhelp's needy survivors. Cathy shares, "Both our parents loved their adopted country and never forgot to be grateful and pay it forward. To honor our parents' wishes and continue their work, we established an emergency financial fund in their name to ensure that Holocaust survivors can live out their lives in dignity, and hopefully, comfort. It is a privilege to be able to, in some small way, assist those unable to help themselves."

JUDI KENDE

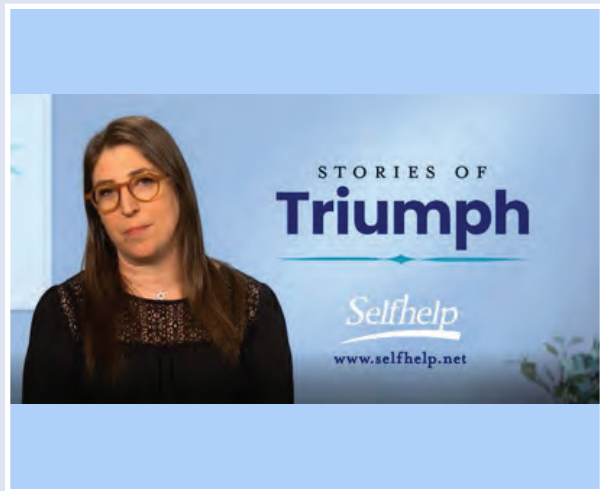

Expanding our Reach Through Affordable Senior Housing



Groundbreaking at Hunters Point South

Together with our partner TF Cornerstone, Selfhelp Realty Group (SRG) broke ground on Selfhelp’s 12th project, located in Hunters Point South, a mixed-use development in Long Island City. SRG is part of the development team for the project and Selfhelp Community Services will be providing social services to the residents in the 100 units of affordable senior housing.

Opening of the Joseph and Pauline Charatan Residence

Selfhelp celebrated the opening of our eleventh affordable housing building, located at 333 Lenox Road in Brooklyn, with a special ribbon cutting ceremony. The building was officially named the Joseph and Pauline Charatan Residence in recognition of the extraordinary friendship and support of Debrah Lee Charatan, Vice-Chair of the SCS Foundation Board.

Growth on Long Island

- Nassau County’s Office for the Aging awarded a contract to Selfhelp to provide case management services to older adults in parts of Nassau County. As this program expands to its full capacity, we expect to serve approximately 500 older adults throughout the area.
- Selfhelp received a grant from UJA-Federation to provide transportation for Long Island Holocaust survivors to go to medical appointments, visit family members, attend socialization activities, and visit cemeteries to pay their respects to loved ones. Having recently launched the program, we have already provided 120 rides.
- Selfhelp Realty Group was awarded financing for our senior housing project in Freeport, Long Island. This development is being designed by Daniel Libeskind and will include 44 units of housing, community space, a recreational rooftop terrace and walking track, as well as many green and energy efficient features.

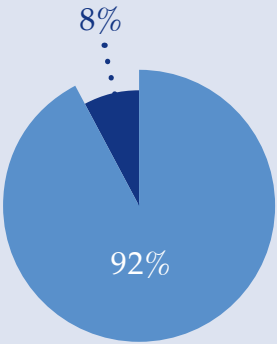

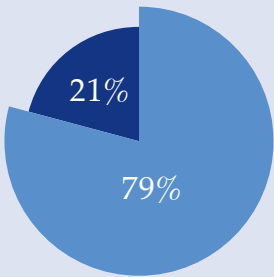
Alarminglly, half of the survivors in our care live at or below the federal poverty line, depending greatly on Selfhelp for assistance. Three of our core programs are funded in part through the generosity of individuals and foundations. Your support will make a tremendous difference in the lives of those we serve.

Our **Emergency Financial Assistance Program** provides survivors in financial need with grants for medical and dental procedures, Medigap insurance, rent, utility bills, citizenship fees, air conditioners, and other critical items and services.



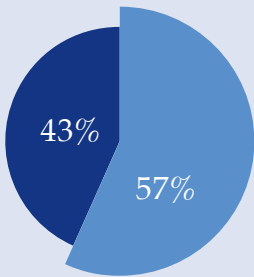

To alleviate isolation and loneliness, Selfhelp offers regular **Coffee House** gatherings -- comfortable, uplifting events where survivors socialize, sing, dance, and are surrounded by those who understand them best.

For Holocaust survivors who can no longer manage their financial or domestic affairs, Selfhelp may be appointed their legal guardian, a role we carry out with great care and compassion. As the only **Guardianship program** designed specifically for Holocaust survivors, we ensure that their wishes are fulfilled and that they live with comfort and dignity.

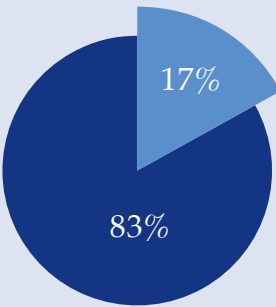

Holocaust Education

The Claims Conference published the results of a Holocaust awareness study, which found the following: 66% of millennials do not know about Auschwitz; 41% believe that fewer than two million Jews were killed in the Holocaust; and 22% of millennials say they hadn’t even heard of the Holocaust.

In response, Selfhelp launched a Holocaust Educational Initiative targeting schools, young professionals and community groups.

Educational components include our acclaimed *Witness Theater* documentary along with a study guide and website, digital advertising campaigns, and Holocaust artwork and food memories projects. Now more than ever, we need to educate future generations about tolerance, sensitivity and respect for all people.

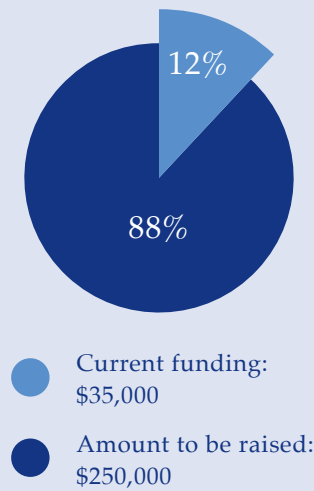


Staff Training and Development

Selfhelp cares for our 20,000 clients, one person at a time, through the dedicated work of our staff. 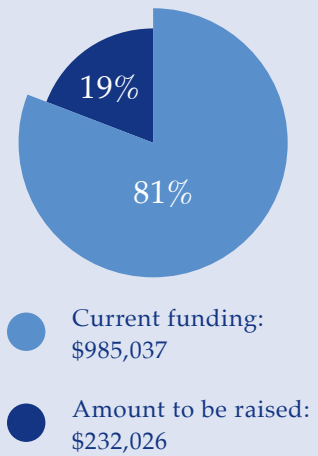

Housing with Services

With 11 residences and four new projects underway, Selfhelp is providing affordable housing to close to 1,500 older adults, enabling them to live independently in the community. Results of a three year study demonstrated that residents in Selfhelp housing experience fewer hospitalizations and utilize the emergency room less frequently than those in the same zip code and in the same demographic categories. They also experience shorter hospital stays with lower costs to Medicaid and Medicare.

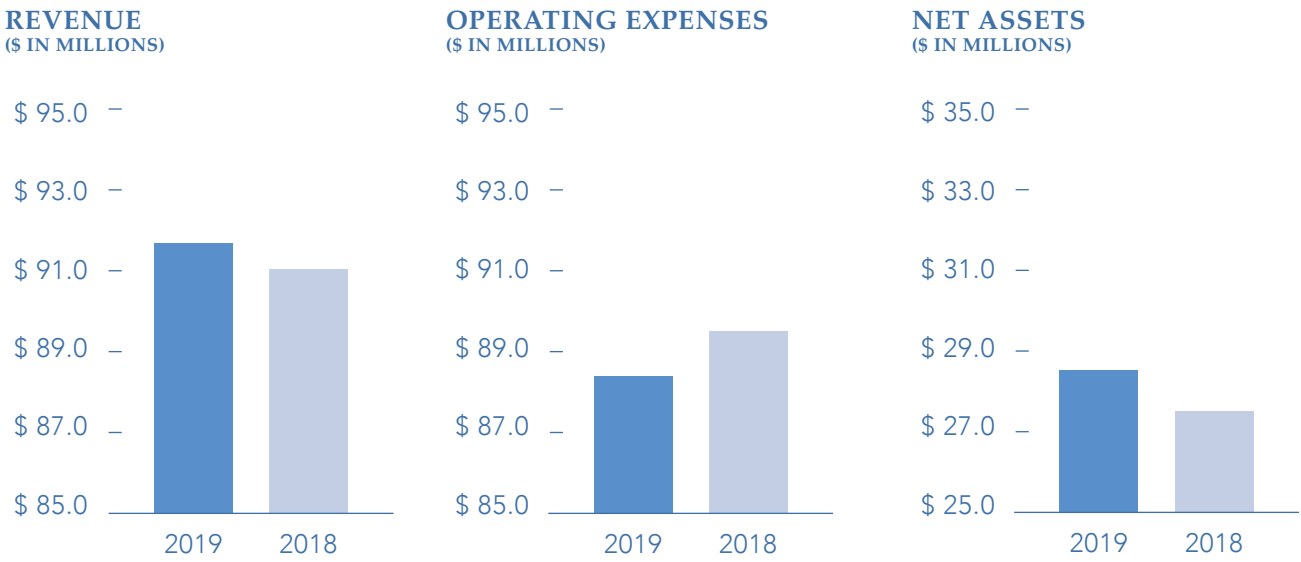
Through our model, called SHASAM (Selfhelp Active Services for Aging Model), each residence has a culturally competent social worker, who can offer assistance with benefits and entitlements, educational, wellness, social and recreational programs, volunteer opportunities and more.



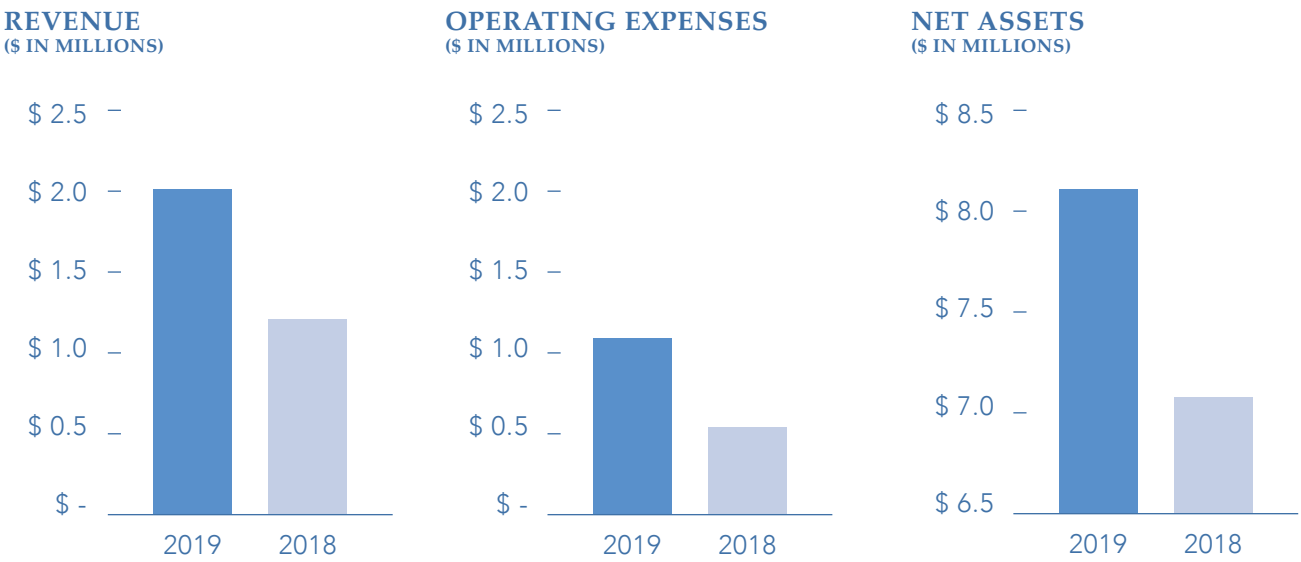
